



The airline was founded under the name "Airzena" in September 1993 as a Charter Airline operating by TU-154 to UAE, China, Egypt and other destinations, gradually developing into scheduled airline.

In 1999 Airzena becomes the flag carrier of Georgian aviation.



In the beginning of 2000 Airzena leases in first two BOEING 737-500 type aircrafts from "Hapag-Lloyd", and becomes the first Georgian carrier to introduce western aircraft in its fleet.

In October 2004 the Airline company changed its name into

"Georgian Airways LTD"

However, continues to use its former name for brand awareness reasons.



In 2007 Georgian Airways introduces two new CRJ-100 type aircrafts to its fleet. Same year it introduces E-Tickets and launches sales via company's website www.airzena.com

In 2009 the Airline successfully completes IATA Operational Safety Audit (IOSA).

In 2010 Georgian Airways becomes member of IATA.

Fleet maintenance:

In-house Part 145 approved maintenance; professional team of 62 engineers and mechanics; The maintenance facility with cutting-edge technologies and equipment.



Our aircrafts are operated by pilots that have been certified to II and IIIA categories, which qualifies them for operations in the adverse weather conditions.

All crews have undergone initial training programs abroad:

Boeing Crew: USA (Boeing Training Centre), Germany (Hapag Lloyd), Czech Republic (CSA),

CRJ Crew: ICARE Training Centre (France)

Our flight attendants take professional training courses at Tbilisi Aviation Institute, in different training centers in Ukraine, in Czech republic and Germany.

Cabin Crew training lasts up to 6 months and involves key theory and practice sessions.

The selection of flight attendants is subject to series of tests and is carried out according to our airline internal standards.







Our technical maintenance fleet is carried out at Georgian Airways technical maintenance center, with the team of 62 engineers and mechanics.

The personnel was trained at CSA and KLM Technical Maintenance Centers.

The maintenance facility is equipped with cutting-edge technologies and equipment. The Maintenance center was audited and approved by European Aviation Safety Agency (EASA) and was granted EASA PART 145 certificate, that allows the organization to implement maintenance tasks

Our team provides technical maintenance for the foreign Airlines, operating in Tbilisi International Airport.
